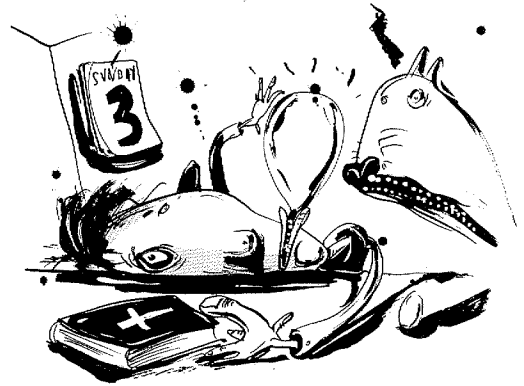


# THE SUNDAY SITUATION
